Issues such as the opening of airspace for commercial and hobby drones on both legal levels and therefore the practices of (registration and) control hold experience and knowledge capital for other (inter)national law in Germany, for example. This strategy is sharpened with the keyword "GLOCAL." Our mission is the formation of the (cyber)citizen, and the means is the Academic Open Innovation event from July 6-8, 2017 in Darmstadt at the GoCore! Summit (GoCore = Governance, Compliance & Regulation), which included the second conference of the Jean Monnet Center of Excellence "EU in Global Dialogue" (CEDI). The goal of GoCore!'s research agenda is to get to the "core" of the challenges as the "heart" of the people (encompassing both translations of the English term "core").5 Five words signal five questions—the number of the fingers in Darmstadt's symbolic five-finger tower as well.
